In our 20+ years of operation, we've encountered numerous challenges, but none as daunting as today's landscape. With a surge in shelter euthanizations and an alarming rise in abandoned dogs, our community faces an unprecedented crisis of overcrowding. Since the onset of the pandemic, the demand for dogs has skyrocketed, leading to a surge in backyard breeding, while access to spaying and neutering services has dwindled. As a result, we now confront a surplus of untrained and unsocialized dogs, overwhelming shelters beyond capacity and prompting widespread abandonment. In these dire times, our mission of rescuing and rehoming dogs at risk has never been more vital.
